An overview of ASAP programs, services and benefits for tailgate markets

The Appalachian Grown™ program of ASAP (Appalachian Sustainable Agriculture Project) certifies food and agricultural products grown or raised on farms in Western North Carolina and the southern Appalachian mountains. Appalachian Grown means Certified Local. Appalachian Grown is a trusted label that helps buyers and shoppers know when they are spending their dollars to the benefit of local family farms and communities.

Appalachian Grown Certification: To become a certified tailgate market with ASAP's Appalachian Grown program the market must be located in our 60-county region of the Southern Appalachians and have a majority of farm vendors at the market selling products they have raised on their own farm.
